



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NOTABLE AREA NEWS

Colter Improvement Project Update 2.0

According to the Phoenix Streets and Transportation Department as well as representatives of Councilwoman Laura Pastor's office, the Colter Street Improvement Project is "not moving forward." Huge thanks to the Colter residents who very clearly expressed their displeasure toward the proposed changes – they really made a difference in the City's decision. Of course, and as we mentioned last issue, the City will continue to look into "solutions" and will communicate regarding these efforts in the City's typically obtuse style. We are optimistic though that the project is not going to move forward in its current iteration any time soon. GREAT WORK EVERYBODY!

Variance Case on 650 East Camelback

The new owner of 650 East Camelback has applied for variances providing for the following: reduce the landscape setback to 0'; reduce the number of parking spaces from 6 to 1; and allow vehicle maneuvering



in the alleyway behind the structure. All of these variance items were made at the request of the City in conjunction with the new owner getting building permits for improvements to the interior of the structure. It's important to note that ALL of the variances are consistent with the current improvements on the property. Put another way: the City just wants the zoning to match what is already there. Our sources in the Planning Department have said that the City will likely decline the land-scape setback change and the alleyway maneuverability request and simply request that the owner change a standard parking space to a handicapped space and grant the interior building permit. The zoning hearing was held after the Newsletter went to press, but the bottom line is it appears that there will be no practical changes from the current condition other than adding a handicapped parking space.

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MEET YOUR WINDSOR SQUARE NEIGHBORS

Meet Rob and Ellen Leonard - Car Enthusiasts



Windsor Square neighbors Rob and Ellen Leonard own an interesting piece of automotive history that they enjoy taking for an occasional spin and sharing with others for weddings and special events.

The car is a 1948 Lincoln Continental with a V12 motor. It has 28,000 true miles which is quite low for its age. The car was originally purchased in LA, and the owner was part of the Bugsy Siegel mob syndicate. As the story goes, the car's owner picked up money from the various prostitution and gambling houses around LA. One evening, the owner was picking up the bags of money from

the various illegal places, and he was gunned down and murdered in the vehicle. The bullets hit the car and windshield, eventually killing the mobster. The windshield was replaced, but the bullet hole in the car still exists today.

The widow of the mobster stored the car for 12 years (1948-1960), and the car was sold to Rob's father in 1960 through Tom Barrett, who later came to run Barrett–Jackson Auction Company. The car had 8000 miles on it when it was sold. It has been restored twice since 1960, is in mint condition, and is a joy for the Leonards to drive!

Generational Families Follow-up

We learned after the last newsletter that board member Hope Webber on 6th Street and her mother-in-law, Joy, on Pasadena St. have been in the neighborhood for eight years. Hope's mom was also a Windsor Square resident before she passed. Remaining close as parents were aging was both convenient and a blessing. IN THE GARDEN



Nastursiums for the Neighborhood

Nastursiums are the ideal no fuss/high reward bloomer, providing showy blossoms all winter long that are



bright yellow, red and orange. Nasturtium is the common name of Tropaeolum majus. It is one species in a genus of about 80 species of annual and perennial herbaceous flowering plants in the family Tropaeolaceae native to South America and Central America, from Mexico to Chile. They can handle full sun or part shade and grow easily in pots or beds. They do have a tendency to "climb" a little if near a taller plant. These peppery tasting flowers are a great addition to salads or as an edible garnish on a cheese board.

Meg Smeck first got going with her seeds shared by her neighbor Rob who had harvested from his garden on Pasadena. He coached that they are hearty and reseed themselves every year so to be sure to plant them in a place where

you can handle natural reseeding. Meg planted the seeds in front of the canna lilies in both of her front beds (also a garden share from Dr. Phil who lived on 2nd St.) When the weather turns hot, nastursiums go to seed, and Meg has enjoyed harvesting the abundance of seeds to share with friends and neighbors.

Meg has a box on her front porch with free FCFS seed packets at 302 E. Pasadena. You can just stick the seeds in the soil now and with a little water, they will take off and bloom all winter long and in to the spring. It is Meg's dream to have these easy to grow, bright pops of color all throughout Windsor Square. Lady Bird Johnson took on Texas to seed wildflowers, but Meg finds our neighborhood a much more realistic goal! Please do stop by and start some nastursiums of your own, and then pass the seeds along to others from your garden later this year. Who knows, Windsor Square could become a mecca for nastursiums!

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


















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
